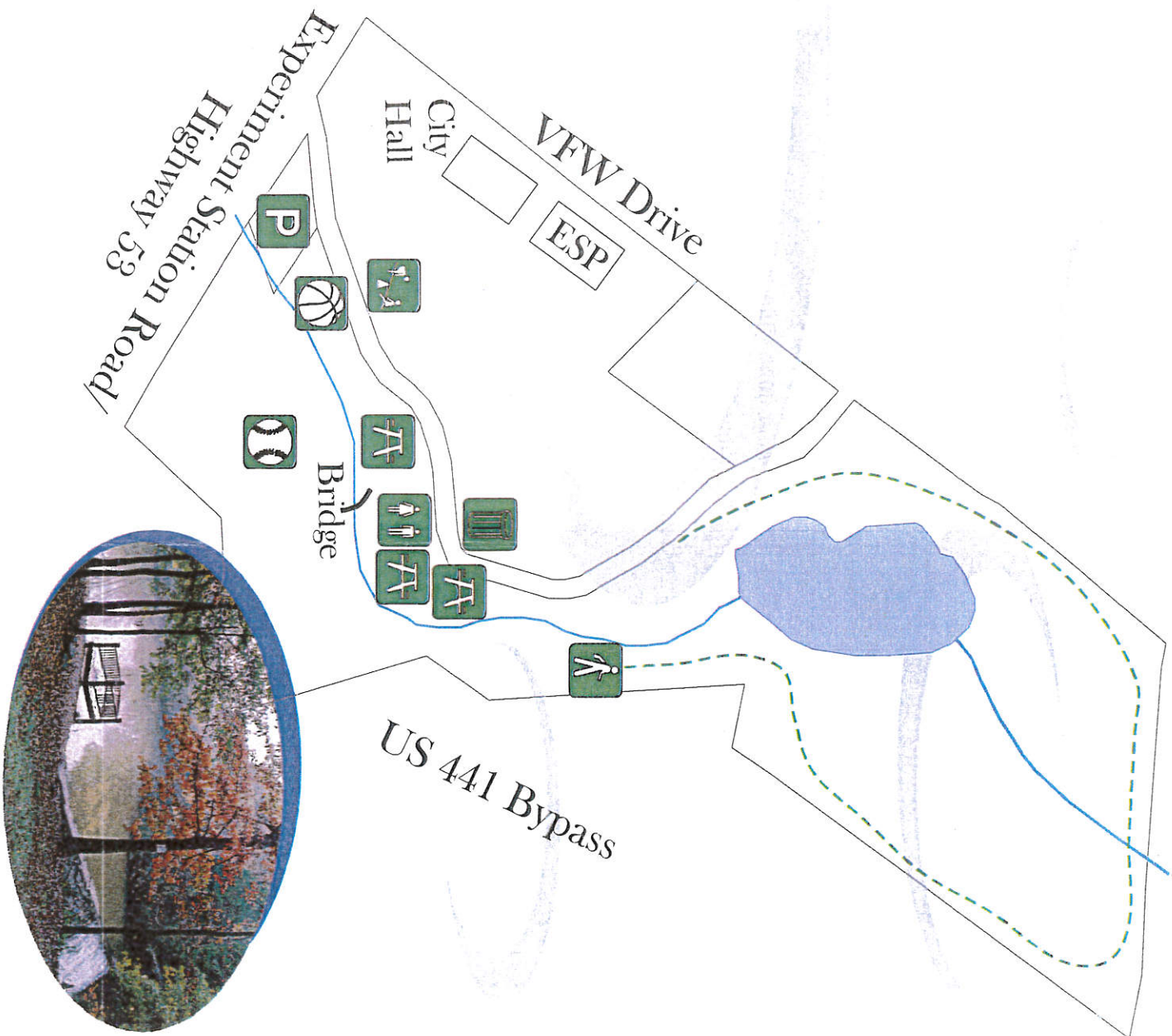


The City's efforts ...

The City has the following ongoing activities to protect natural resources:

- **Public Education** — efforts, like this brochure, to provide information on storm water issues.
- **Public Participation** — Look for opportunities to participate in stream clean-up activities.
- **Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination** — Decals are being installed to remind all of us not to dump in the storm drains.
- **Construction Site Control** — The City and County are working together to enforce erosion control on construction sites.
- **Long-term storm water management** — Permanent storm water controls need to be maintained to protect water resources.
- **Good housekeeping for municipal operations** — The City picks up trash and leaf/limb, and maintains City property to minimize water pollution.

What can YOU do?

At Harris Shoals Park:

- Pick up your trash
- Protect vegetation near the creek and lake
- Clean up after your pet



Careful use protects water resources in Harris

At home:

- Never dump anything down a storm drain or into a drainage ditch
- Recycle motor oil and other vehicle fluids
- Use fertilizer and pesticide only when needed

Calls Creek

Calls Creek begins between the Bishop's Vineyard and Christian Lake subdivisions and flows through Christian Lake, through wetlands into Harris Shoals Park. Then it continues across Experiment Station and North Main Street and out of the City.

Calls Creek receives storm water runoff from more than half of the City — all of the section north of the railroad tracks. Everyone has a role to play in protecting the natural resources of the city, including Calls Creek.
